Introduction



The Trip we are Planning


Core trip planned around a 10-day itinerary starting in Tokyo and ending in Osaka with visits to:

- Hiroshima

Flexibility (at own cost) to:

Goals of Expo 2025 Osaka Kansai

- To contribute to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
- Achievement of Japan's national strategy Society 5.0
- In 2025, the world will be a mere five years away from 2030, the year the United Nations has set as the target for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), making it a crucial one for ramping up efforts to achieve these goals. Therefore, Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai will become a key platform for reaching the SDGs by 2030.



Travel

- Pick up from Narita or Haneda Airport chartered coach
- Tokyo, Mt. Fuji, & Hakone– chartered coach
- Tokyo to Hiroshima bullet train (have an overnight bag or carry-on and one luggage will be shipped to Kyoto hotel)
- Hiroshima to Kyoto bullet train
- Kyoto to Nara chartered coach
- Kyoto to Osaka chartered coach
- Osaka Airport chartered coach



Accommodations

- Day 1-Day 4: Grand Prince Hotel Shin Takanawa
- Day 4-Day 6: Hotel Granvia Hiroshima
- Day 6-Day 8: Miyako Hotel Kyoto Hachijo
- Day 8-Day 9: Hotel Monterey Grasmere Osaka

Accommodations will be at these hotels or similar hotels in price and quality.



Cost of Tour Package

- \$3500-4000 CAD for 15+ participants*
- \$4500 CAD for 10-14 participants*
- Rates are based on double occupancy and may be subject to change due to fluctuations in currency

We are not trying to offer the cheapest tour, but a tour that is as worry-free and experiential as possible!



Exchange Factor – Much Volatility but better than past years

- \$1 CAD = 110 JYE
- 10 year low: \$1 CAD = 75 JYE
- 10 year high: \$1 CAD = 119 JYE
 *set Jul 2024
- 1 year low: \$1 CAD = 104 JYE
 *set Sep 2024

5 year appreciation 34% 10 year appreciation 10%



What is Included

- Tour price includes 8 breakfasts and 2 lunches.
- One piece luggage transfer between Tokyo and Kyoto hotel
- Admissions



What is NOT Included

- Airfare
- Insurance
- Drinks on meals
- Meals not mentioned in the included section



What is NOT Included

- All participants would have to book their own flights
- Have the option to arrive earlier and/or stay longer in Japan.
- NAJC could assist them with flight bookings and provide some support for those wishing to come earlier or depart later
- May 7th from Vancouver using WestJet with stop in Calgary averaging \$1,100



Terms & Conditions

- Payment is to be made by 60 days prior to group arrival date to Japan.
- Once you agree our term and condition for your trip to Japan, we will ask you for the deposit payment at \$300 per person at the time of booking.
- 35 days prior to group arrival date would be the deadline for the booking of additional person.

Proposed Tour Start Dates

- May 7th or 10th
- October 1^{st} or 4^{th}
- Additional tours on those dates or tours during June/July/August/September may be offered if sufficient interest exists




